

Luzhniki Sports Complex, Moscow



Luzhniki Sports Complex, the largest sports complex in Europe, as well as a public space with playgrounds and rest areas. All facilities combine into a single architectural and park ensemble. Luzhniki is the centre of mass and amateur sports, one of the popular spots for outdoor recreation and sports activities in Moscow.

The stadium is not only a sports arena, but also the largest concert venue in Russia that is used to hosting world-known bands and performers.



# MOSCOW CABLE CAR LINE



Vorobyovy Gory -  
the Luzhniki Complex



Moscow Cable Car line was launched in 2018, connecting the Luzhniki and Vorobyovy Gory sports facilities. The length of the line is 720 metres with two terminal and one intermediate (Novaya Liga) stations. You can reach the view point on Vorobyovy Gory from the Luzhniki Complex in a weather-tight car in just five minutes.





As part of the Forum, Festival participants will be able to learn about organized routes and rest stops while travelling through Russia.





The Red Square and Moscow Kremlin Museums



The Moscow Kremlin is a fortress in the heart of Moscow and the oldest part of the city. It is Moscow's main sociopolitical, historical and artistic centre and the official residence of the President of the Russian Federation. It is one of the most famous architectural ensembles in the world.





Cathedral of Christ the Saviour and Patriarshy Bridge



The Cathedral of Christ the Savior is a Russian Orthodox cathedral located on Ulitsa Volkhonka in Moscow. The existing structure, built in the 1990s, is a replica of the place of worship of the same name that was destroyed in 1931.






## Zaryadye Park



Zaryadye is a public space and a cultural and educational centre in Moscow. It is located in the historic district of the same name and was created on the site of the Rossiya hotel, which was demolished in 2006. It occupies an area of 13 hectares between Kitaigorodsky Proezd, Ulitsa Varvarka and Moskvoretskaya Naberezhnaya.


## Stary Arbat



Arbat is a street in Moscow's Central Administrative District (Arbat District). It runs from Arbatskiye Vorota to Smolenskaya Ploshchad and lies between Ulitsa Prechistenka and Novy Arbat. The houses are numbered starting with the Arbatskiye Vorota square.

Exhibition of Achievements of National Economy



An exhibition centre in Moscow's Ostankinsky District and the second largest in the city. It is one of the world's 50 largest exhibition centres. VDNKh welcomes 30 million visitors annually. The exhibition celebrated its 80th anniversary on 1 August 2019.







## Ostankino Television Tower



Ostankino Television Tower is a television and radio broadcasting tower located in Moscow's Ostankinsky District. The building reaches a height of 540.1 m and as of September 2019 is the 14th tallest man-made structure in human history. It is the tallest building in Europe and Russia, and a full member of the World Federation of Great Towers.






## State Tretyakov Gallery



Merchant Pavel Tretyakov opened an art museum in Moscow in 1856. As of 2018, the museum counts over 180,000 items including paintings, sculptures and jewellery made from precious metals in its collection, created between the 11th and 20th centuries.







Poklonnaya Gora



The Victory Park memorial centre to honour Russia's victory in the Second World War was built on this hill in the 1980s and 1990s.




# MOSCOW LANDMARKS



## Kolomenskoye Museum-Reserve



A palace estate and former royal residence (from 1640), located to the south of Moscow. In 1923, a museum and national park was created on the estate to allow the public to see its traditional Russian wooden architecture.





Tsaritsyno Museum-Reserve



Tsaritsyno is a palace and park in the south of Moscow, founded by order of empress Catherine the Great in 1776. It became the Tsaritsyno Museum-Reserve in 1984.







## Izmailovo Kremlin



The Kremlin in Izmailovo is a cultural and entertainment centre built in 1998–2007 at the Izmailovo estate. It is a wooden building constructed in the style of 16th and 17th century Russian architecture, and is an example of new historicism.






Petrovsky  
Road Palace



An unusual red and white building with intricate decorative details, surrounded by low-rise administrative buildings with turrets designed to look like serfs. The Petrovsky Palace was built at the entrance to Moscow during the reign of Catherine the Great.
